"No matter who you are or where you've been, you are welcome here!



"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." 1 Corinthians 12:12

Part of Paul's first letter to the Church at Corinth discussed the make-up of the church. As you can see, he says the church has many members, all of whom are a part of the one body. Continuing with the analogy Paul writes about how those parts work together for a common goal, the Kingdom of God.

"For the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. "1 Corinthians 12:14-15

While Paul goes into further anatomical discussion, I think you get his point.

At present, the roles of Central Baptist Church show 218 active members. And yet, on a given Sunday our attendance hovers between 50 and 70. That's about 148 active members, on average, not showing up. Just as the body cannot function properly without all of its parts, the church cannot most effectively do the work of God's Kingdom with people missing.

All 218 "active" members of this church, and even more future members, have a part to play in the Great Commission. From teaching God's word to dusting off the window sills, no job is more or less important than any other. The church cannot function well if the work is not done. Perhaps your call is simply to be here, showing steadfast dedication to honoring God, for the next generation to see.

As we look forward to a new chapter in the history of Central Baptist Church, we are incomplete without all of our members. You are a part of that history, and more importantly a part of that future.

Church still starts at 10, and the doors are open. We pray that we will see you there.



Through the generous contributions of past and present members of Central Baptist Church, we are able to award college scholarships to church members to assist in paying for education expenses. The amount of each scholarship will vary according to available funds and the number of applicants.

Scholarship Criteria

- 1. The applicant and/or immediate family must be an active participant(s) of Central Baptist Church.

- 3. Applicant must maintain a minimum "C" average.
- 4. Applicant may receive up to four (4) undergraduate scholarships and two (2) graduate scholarships.

All members of Central Baptist are eligible to apply.

Scholarships will be awarded on June 8th Children's Sunday.

Deadline for applying is **May 14th**.
